What is the reading competition?

The goal is to give the kids an explosive start on their reading! Previously 50 000 children from almost 3000 classes have participated in the competition. They read 100 million pages combined.

The reading competition is almost like a video game, with «levels» and trophies, and is arranged by Norli Bokhandel and several Norwegian publishers.

How to enter?

- The competition starts 12. September. On norlijunior.no the kids make a profile where they document their reading.
- The teacher will provide you with a code. You will need a code to join your class.
- If you have been on [norlijunior](http://norlijunior.no) before, you can use the same profile.

Goals and competition is fun!

- The class read to get to different levels, and win diplomas.
- All classes who read 800 pages per pupil wins medals.
- All classes who read 3000 pages per pupil receives a class-trophy.
- **Norgesligaen:** The class who read the most in Norway, receives a big trophy.
- **Klassetrinnsligaen:** The class who reads the most on each grade in Norway, receives 2000,- kroner. If several classes read the same amount, they all get awarded.
- **Fylkesligaen:** The class who reads the most in each county receives a trophy.
- **Språkligaen:** The class who reads books in several different languages, receives a trophy.
- **Superligaen:** Kids who read books with a lot of text gets bonus. The teacher gives 20 % bonus pages when the pupils read books with at least 27 lines on each page. The class who reads the most pages with bonus-books wins a trophy. The teacher decides if the class should participate in the superliga.
- **Skoleligaen:** The school can arrange their own competitions and have difference prices.
- **Kommuneligaen:** Municipalities that want to arrange competitions between schools can get their own result list. Contact norlijunior@norli.no to create lists.

This is what the pupils can read and register:

Read what you want to, books read in the period 12. September – 9. December can be registered.

- We encourage the kids to read books on their own level. 7th graders should not read books that are meant for 3-year-olds, to be able to register more pages.
- Books/e-books in all languages – novels, non-fiction, and comic-books.
- Audiobooks and books read aloud (are registered as minutes read)
- Reading in schoolbooks should not be registered (science, geography etc.). If a short story is printed in a school book, it can be registered.

Important! Thousands of children make an enormous effort during the reading competition. It is therefore important that the competition is fair and that no one cheats. We ask that both parents and teachers emphasize to the children how important it is not to cheat. Cheating is writing up books you haven't read and registering too many pages.

Every week, a children's book author will appear on Norli Junior to talk about their books, organize competitions and motivate reading. Among the authors you will find football-players Ada and Andrine Hegerberg, hip-hop dancer Mona Berntsen and Ragnarok-author Odin Helgheim. 

Uke 37: Nicolai Houm – *Helt super*

You don't have to be a superhero to be totally awesome! The 11-year-old gamer Hedvig has her life turned upside down as she suddenly has to take over the role of the town's big superhero. But Hedvig is no superhero, and the problems keep coming. Perfectly suitable for 1st to 5th grade.



Uke 38: Comics med Odin og Sara

Odin Helgheim has written a new book in the Ragnarok universe, and it is called *Tordenguden*. In the book *Mia Myhr og barna som forsvant* Sara Hjardar has created a chilling fantasy universe. The books are suitable for 4th to 7th grade.

Uke 39: Ada og Andrine Hegerberg – *2+2=5*

2+2=5 is the second book about the soccer sisters Ada and Andrine. This is a book about how difficult it can be to stand out, and about how having siblings can be both one of the best and worst things there is. Suitable for 1st to 5th graders.



Uke 40: Dag Otto Lauritzen og Frode Eie Larsen – *Mot og mysterier*

An exciting series for children and young people. Each book has an independent mystery, and each book is linked to a natural phenomenon. All the books contain advice and stories about courage, motivation and willpower linked to the book's theme. Suitable for 4th to 7th grade.

Uke 41: Robert Stoltenberg og Harald M. Stoltenberg – *Turbotvillingene og den store kanonballkampen*

Turbotvillingene og den store kanonballkampen is a hysterically funny and heartwarming story about being a good brother, a good friend and a good person. This is the first book in a richly illustrated series and is suitable for 1st to 5th grade.



Uke 42: Alexander H. Sandtorv – *VitenGALskap 1: Elleville eksperimenter*

Comedy and science are a beautiful combination. The new series *VitenGALskap* is a lively and crazy presentation of science and all the weird things that drive the world forward. The series is perfect for 1st to 7th graders.

Uke 43: Mona Berntsen – *Mona og dansedrømmen*

Mona loves to dance. Not just a little, she really loves it. But the other girls at school are mean to Mona's best friend, Benji. When the girls suddenly need Mona's help, she doesn't know what to do. *Flow* is a new illustrated series about daring to follow your dreams. Suitable for 1st to 5th grade.




Uke 44: Tegneserier med Victor og Cha

Victor Nordahls book *Revefarmen* is an exciting and warm graphic novel from the perspective of a fox. In the book series *Dragens Øye*, Cha Sandmæl has created a fantastic universe full of magic. The books are suitable for grades 3rd to 7th grade.



Uke 45: Marius Molaug – *Verdens verste kjæledyr*

Lots of humour, fun illustrations and an everyday life that rarely goes smoothly make the *Verdens verste*-books an entertaining, easy-to-read and fun reading experience for both children and adults. Perfect for readers in 1st to 7th grade.



Uke 46: Toralf Fagertun – *Familien Gnork*

Familien Gnork is a crazy and cheerful story about friendship, enmity, spiders, flying crocodiles and home-made medicine with incredible side effects. And football, of course. This richly illustrated book is perfect for 4th to 7th graders.



Uke 47: Ida Tufte Michelsen – *Alma Freng og strålemerkene*

The magical story of Alma Freng continues in a new book. The series is about heroism, secrets, and incredible powers. Perfect as a read-aloud book for 1st grade and up, or as a read-it-yourself book for 4th to 7th graders.



Uke 48: Bjørn Sortland – *Mission 5: Los Angeles*

Jon works as agent Johnny 777 for the secret organization EHO. Together with the Ninja Princess, he has been on wild missions all over the world. Now they are going to Los Angeles – to Hollywood! This humorous action series is perfect for ages 1st to 5th grade.
